- MS invited to establish clear procedures to identify informal carers and support the in their care giving activities by:
 - Facilitating cooperation with LTC workers
 - Supporting access to training incl. OSH, counselling., healthcare, psychological support and respite care, as well as supporting them in balancing work and care responsibilities
 - Provide access to social protection and/or adequate financial support, while not deterring labour market participation

Needs assessment



Standardized needs assessment instruments, comprehensive assessment



The Lisbon Outcomes Statement

We call for:

- prioritization of preventive measures for physical, social and mental well-being, ensuring availability of support and services throughout the life-course through;
- creation of **enabling environments**, including age-friendly cities and communities, to empower individuals across the life-course to engage with their communities, and improvement of service accessibility;
- provision of accessible, affordable, high-quality care and support for older people, their caregivers and families across care settings, encompassing primary health care, hospitals and long-term care, while integrating all levels of care within a continuum;
- effective implementation of policies to leverage the potential of older people; and
- strong data and evidence to inform actions that foster healthy ageing
